The Tom Robertson Community Business Investment award was created in recognition of Tom Robertson, who has dedicated decades of hours to establish an ongoing supporting Family Foundation for the longevity of The House Next Door. The successful growth of the Foundation's assets over the years is the combination of donor gifts and prudent investing.

The recipient of the Cecil Paul and Maria Jones Community Hero Award must have demonstrated over a significant period of time, dedication to the promotion of nurturing and empowering families in our community, combined with a strong sense of civic duty.

This year's recipient is a distinguished professor and author whose influence extends beyond academic dimension. Being a South American has underscored his perspective that society must ensure that all individuals are provided with adequate education and opportunities to pursue a successful life wherever they choose to live and work.

Professionally he focuses on the integration of substance abuse and other life concerns from a cultural perspective and cultural diversity training for counselors, administrators, and policy makers in medical, human and other services. The Gail Hallmon Champion of Families Award

The Gail Hallmon Champion of Families Award was created in recognition of Gail Hallmon, who has dedicated decades of volunteer hours to championing families in our community. She spent many years championing families through her volunteer work with Parent Craft, as a Girl Scout Leader, taking PTA leadership positions, mission trip work with First Presbyterian Church, IDignity and countless other community events.

To be eligible for this award, the recipient must have demonstrated over a significant period of time, dedication to the promotion of nurturing and empowering families in our community, combined with community service geared toward families.

Our recipient this year is a respected Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) leader nationally recognized for originating university and community-based programs to facilitate candid discussions about law and the intersectionality of race, diversity and poverty. Alumnus of Harvard College and University of Virginia School of Law with over 20 years of experience leading, building and maintaining a culture of diversity, equity and inclusion within these higher education environments through active involvement in various admission, scholarship selection, alumni business and individual clients seeking smart legal solutions for employment, business and elder law matters. He serves as outside counsel to our local taxing district and small businesses, a neutral investigator, mediator or arbitrator to resolve litigation disputes.

Ted has hosted years long series of roundtable community discussion known as the "Color Line Roundtable" which facilities discussions on the problem of the color line. Ted's facilitation of this series has directly impacted families in our community, in his tireless effort provide safe spaces to hold tough conversation about the opportunity of solutions for the complex problems of racism and poverty.
